Who Knew?

Earlier this year I came across a Hemmings.com story from 2013 about the death of Dean Jeffries. Jeffries was a California customizer who had a varied career that was documented by Tom Cotter (of the web series Barn Find Hunter) in his book Dean Jeffries; 50 Fabulous Years in Hot Rods, Racing & Film. I was fortunate to spend the better part of a day with Tom on a recent trip to NC, so the story caught my eye.

Among his other accomplishments, Jeffries painted the very first Shelby Cobra and built the Monkeemobile. He was George Barris' in-house pinstriper, striped James Dean's infamous Porsche 550 Spyder with the nick-



name "Li'l Bastard," and built Chili Catallo's 1932 Ford 3window coupe, the one that the **Beach Boys** used on the Cover of their *Little Deuce* Coupe album.

He also built a number of concept cars for Ford, including a gullwing-door show car called the Cougar.

> The 1962 Ford Cougar 406 Concept had popup headlights and a fuel injected 6.7 liter V8. Although Ford never put this Cougar into production, it appeared with Jack Lemmon behind the wheel in the film Under the Yum Yum Tree.

Gene Mullenberg's '73 XR-7 convertible CJ

I purchased this '73 XR-7 convertible from the original owners in October of 2010. The owners were retiring and moving, so the car had to go. It had a little over 91k original miles on it and had been sitting in a garage for 27 years due to a timing chain issue. The Cat was complete with the exception of wheels and



air cleaner.

This wasn't just any XR-7 convertible, it had the optional 351CJ with a C6 and was a special order paint car (dark brown). Other options included PS, PDB, PW, AC and AM/ FM stereo.

A mechanical restoration began in January of 2011 and completed the following June. The convertible top was cleaned and the paint was buffed. The Cat was driven occasionally for several years, then in the spring of 2019 a cosmetic restoration was done including new top, complete paint color change (dark

green) and interior repair. A hood scoop and factory Ram Air

system were added. Everything was completed in late June. The Cat made its first showing at the 2019 Yellow Rose.

351CJ (did not need to be bored), C6 with shift kit, 3.25 Traction Lok, double roller timing chain, 519/270/110 cam, Eddlebrock intake, Holly 600, Pertronix EI, 1969 stock Cleveland distributor, 2.5" exhaust, Series 40 Flowmasters.

Gloria Farabaugh's '69 Standard Convertible

I bought this '69 STD convertible from the original owner, a

Dallas Police officer, in '78. He purchased the Cat on July 5, 1969 at Eagle Lincoln Mercury on Lemmon Ave in Dallas. The car was built on June 18, 1969 at the Dearborn, Michigan plant.

My father (Raul Ramirez) was working as an upholsterer at the dealership when the police officer traded in the car in '78. My dad is a big fan of Cougars

and thought it would be a good car for me. I drove the

car throughout college and several years afterward. I don't know how many miles it had when I bought it, but I do know that I put plenty of miles on it driving back and forth to East Texas! Unfortu-

nately, cost of repairs was more than I could deal with and I really didn't want to sell the car, so the family stored it for me. Then, in '97 it was decided it was time to get this beautiful car back in shape and on the road again. Although it took twice as long and cost twice as much as planned, it was well worth it! The original color was light ivy yellow, but was changed to a dark green. The interior was


